Integral's copper theft concerns

As part of a new public campaign, Integral Energy is urging anyone with information about copper theft from substations, power lines and power poles in the Lithgow area to report it anonymously to CrimeStoppers on 1800 333 000.

Integral Energy has joined forces with CrimeStoppers and other utilities to call for public support to report copper theft and other vandalism of important community infrastructure, Integral Energy's Chief Financial Officer, Daniel Lucas, said.

"Interfering with substations and other parts of our electricity network can cause disruptions to our services, and copper theft alone costs Integral Energy more than \$200,000 a year to replace or repair," Mr Lucas, who is responsible for the corporation's security program, said.

"The 'Copper theft — don't cop it!' campaign is aimed at stopping people interfering with public utilities, which is illegal and dangerous.

"Thieves and vandals on our sites risk serious injury or electrocution and also put the community at risk.

"The price of stolen copper isn't worth dying for.

"It's important members of the public report suspected copper theft and other vandalism of our power network to the police," he said.
